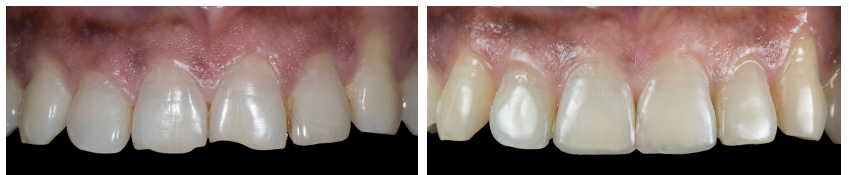
The celebrations begin with adorations of
